#### BGE BEGINS "SMART METER" INSTALLATION PROGRAM

In case you missed the notices that have been enclosed in your recent utility bills, BGE is converting all home and business gas and electric meters to "Smart Meters". Smart Meters are advanced digital devices that capture and store energy consumption data in much more detail than the current meters, and they can communicate electronically with BGE offices. **Howard County** installations are scheduled for the timeframe between **December 2012 and May 2013**. BGE will be telling us about the new features and capabilities of the meters and providing more details about the installation process in utility bill enclosures throughout the rest of this year.

GABLES Super-Discount on Chimney Cleaning and Inspection

FOR YOUR CONSIDERATION: Everyone knows that a chipped or cracked flue can lead to dangerous chimney fires. But water damage from leaks in the chimney cap, crown, or siding can be just as devastating. If you see rust stains along the outside top of your (brick or aluminum) chimney (at the cap or storm collar), or if you see black mold in your chimney brickwork, chances are high that you have a leak! Failure to repair the problem can lead to very costly structural damage to your flue or firebox, and even to the flooring foundation.


The Howard County Department of Public Works has agreed to replace many of the broken and tilted sections of sidewalk which pose tripping-hazards throughout our community. Repairs will likely commence in late August. Prior to the start of the work, County contractors will paint all repair-targeted areas with a large "X".

If the sidewalk is in front of or alongside a home, a notecard will also be attached to the house's front door to advise of the pending construction activity. The process of jack-hammering and removing the marked sidewalk sections and then filling them in with new concrete may take several weeks to complete, so your patience (and careful control of children and pets) during this process will be very much appreciated!

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## Greetings from the Historic Elkridge Assembly Hall

Our neighbors on Lawyers' Hill Road (some of whom reside on registered historic properties) have invited members of The GABLES Community to join their social group:

The Elkridge Assembly Rooms, Inc.

The group meets at 6:30pm on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Monday of each month in the Historic Assembly Room building on Lawyers' Hill Rd for group pot-luck dinners, socializing, and general community information-sharing. The Assembly Hall (located on the left-hand side of Lawyer's Hill Road about 0.3 miles after you turn right from Summer Home Terrace) has no heat and no restroom facilities, so the pot-luck dinners usually run only from April through October each year. Anyone who wants to attend is asked to bring a hot or cold dish sufficient to feed 6-8 people, along with your own place settings and beverages. Parking is available along Old Lawyers' Hill Road, or along the driveway of the Bonniewood property at 6117 Lawyers' Hill Rd.

Their Annual Meeting will be held this year on June 18th, in coordination with the monthly Pot-Luck dinner.

In addition to their monthly gatherings, the Association sponsors several larger, family-friendly events each year:

- ❖ In the Spring or early Summer, they conduct a group Adopt-a-Road clean-up along Lawyers' Hill Road. This year, members will meet on June 30<sup>th</sup> at 8am at the Assembly Hall to coordinate clean-up activity on Lawyers' Hill Road from Montgomery Rd to Levering Road. Generally, the project takes no more than an hour and a half.
  - Coffee, pastries, and mimosas (YAY!) will be served at the Assembly Hall after the clean-up is completed.
- ❖ An annual 4th of July Event is held at the Assembly Hall and on the property across the street. Festivities begin at 12 noon with a Pot Luck lunch (dishes are brought by individual members), with hot dogs, hamburgers, and beverages provided by the Association. Around 1:30pm, the gathering will move across the street for lawns games and children's games, including hay rides and chicken races. The party will conclude by mid-afternoon.
- Other events that have been hosted in past years include Wine Tastings in the Spring and an Oktoberfest celebration in the Fall.

Annual dues for membership in the Assembly Hall association are \$25 per individual, or \$50 per family. Dues are used to maintain the historic Assembly Hall, and to help fund some of the annual social events. Their fiscal year starts July 1st, so dues are generally collected at the 4th of July party or at the June or July Pot Luck meetings. Payment can be paid in cash or by a check written to
